# **President Garfield's Appointment**

James A. Garfield was a gospel preacher, Civil War general, Congressman, Senator, and President of the United States. History will never be able to judge what kind of leader he might have been because he was shot by a crazed office seeker and died after only six months in office. However, the following story might be the standard one should use in judging his conduct as President.

Early one Sunday morning, a group of party leaders came by the White House to see him and discuss a bill they thought should be passed by Congress. They were surprised when President Garfield said he had a very important appointment and would talk to them later that afternoon.

But Mr. President,+one man asked, What could be more important than this?+ Garfield arose and walked to the door, turned to look at the party leaders, and said, entlemen, I have an appointment at the Lordes table.+ He then left with Mrs. Garfield and went to a Sunday morning worship service.

Some folks are kept away by a rainy day while others are homebound because their pets were unruly! As one man said, õAny excuse is as good as another.ö Read the article and see if it is not the mindset of many in the church today.

The story was told of a preacher who began showing up late for services and even missing the õprayer meetingö altogether. The straw that broke the cameløs back was when he did not show up at all one Lordøs Day because he had taken a drive in the country to see the beautiful fall colors. The õeldersö met and decided to fire the man. The secretary summed it all up in the minutes of the meeting by saying, õlt was clear he cannot be a minister here if he insists on acting like the rest of our membersí ö

I suppose we would all laugh if we could not see so much truth in the notation made by the secretary. Most preachers would be fired if they tried to get away with what some of the members do. Whether we admit it or not, like it or not, we do have a õdouble standard.ö I am not suggesting, by any means that the preacher should be allowed to get by with what some of the members get by with. Neither am I suggesting that we should hold the preacher up as our standard for Christianity, even though he should strive to be a good example (1 Corinthians 11:1). What I am suggesting is that we ALL bring our lives up to the standard Christ set for us. õFor even hereunto were ye called: because Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example, that ye should follow his stepsö (1 Peter 2:21).

May we, one, and all, act like true followers of Christ, and not try to get away with behavior that is anything less. After all, it is a losing proposition to try and get away with anything that is wrong. õFor God shall bring every work into judgment, with every secret thing, whether it be good, or whether it be evilö (Ecclesiastes 12:14).
