## This and That

That baptism is a part of the New Testament teaching none would dispute. It is mentioned in 12 of the 27 books of the New Testament and receives a prominent place in the gospels and Acts of the Apostles. However just what the Bible is conveying about baptism is disputed. Few would deny baptism to one who zealously desires it, but many refute the notion that it is necessary. There are also several different modes of baptism administered as well as a difference in who should be baptized. The Bible is really pretty clear about baptism, at least from my standpoint. I think it can be shown that baptism is part of what God wants us to submit to in obedience to Him.

Baptism is from God: the words baptize or baptism is not mentioned in the Old Testament although washings were a part of the requirements of priests and others on special occasions. The first mention of baptism is in Matthew chapter three. Here it speaks of John the Baptist and how he was baptizing people. In John chapter one, verses 33 and 34, John indicates that God sent him to baptize.

Baptism is common upon hearing about the kingdom and Jesus Christ. In the book of Acts, when people heard teaching about Jesus, they were baptized. The people at Pentecost, the eunuch, Saul, Lydia, the Philippian jailor, and the Corinthians all were baptized after they were taught.

Paul and Peter agreed upon the necessity of baptism. Peter taught it in the first recorded sermon after Jesus rose again. Paul said it was a form of the death, burial, and resurrection of Christ in Romans chapter 6. Peter wrote that it was a means of saving us in First Peter one ó twenty one.

Jesus said to teach and do it. He used some of the last sayings before His ascension to get the message across. In Matthew twenty-eight and Mark sixteen He made sure the apostles knew to administer baptism to those who believed.

Baptism is a burial in water. Paul taught this in Romans chapter six and also in Colossians chapter two. Any other means of administering baptism is foreign to the Bible.

Have you been baptized? Baptism is for the penitent believer to receive remission of sins and admittance into the Church of Christ. Think about it.
