This and That

The apostle John was privileged to watch as Jesus was taken up into heaven. This is recorded in the first chapter of the book of Acts. After gazing for a period of time, John returned from Mount Olivet to Jerusalem. He then labors for over sixty years, telling all who would listen, about salvation through a risen Lord. All of the other apostles gradually pass away, giving their lives for the Gospel cause. John, at last, is banished to a rocky island because he would not compromise the truth. Rather than getting down and feeling depressed, he was “in the Spirit” on the Lord’s Day. This indicates to me that he was worshiping God and Christ on Sunday. Because of this he was again granted the opportunity to see Jesus Christ. In the vision Jesus is described as:

Clothed with a garment down to the foot. He was wearing the garments of a High Priest and King. Jesus is the mediator of a better covenant which was established upon better promises. He is also the King of Kings and Lord of Lords.

Girt about the paps with a golden girdle. A girdle was worn over the flowing robes to fasten them down. One covered in gold was indicative of royalty and dignity.

His head and His hairs were white like wool, as white as snow. This represented his wisdom, purity, and antiquity. There is a similar description of God given in Daniel 7:9

His eyes were as a flame of fire. A fire would give off light and reveal all that is surrounding it. Jesus’ eyes were capable of seeing everything, even the current condition of the great apostle.

His feet like unto fine brass, as if they burned in a furnace. His goings were purified. His feet must have been beautiful and makes one remember the description of the ones who preach the gospel of peace in Romans 10:15.

His voice as the sound of many waters. Waters are a symbol of peoples. Therefore Jesus’ message is for all people for all time.

No wonder John fell at His feet as dead! However the placement of Jesus’ right hand upon John and the words “fear not” were enough to enable him to recover and be the witness Jesus needed. Are you a faithful teacher for Jesus?
