Forgiveness

An Esteemed English clergyman told J. Wallace Hamilton, "The turning point in my life was when I was 17 years old. I always had trouble with my brothers and sisters. I was called the "black sheep" in the family. We were always fighting each other.

One night they were all picking on me until I could stand it no longer. I jumped up and cried, "I'm getting out of here!" I ran into my grandmother. She had been listening to it all. She stood there in the hallway and stopped me by putting her hand on my shoulder. With tears in her eyes she said only a few words to me, but they changed my life. She said, "John, I believe in you."

Right now, imagine God putting His hand on your shoulder. He says to you, "I've heard everything, and I want you to know, I believe in you!"

What a great moment that is! Faith is born anew as you experience His acceptance and forgiveness.

You are Who God Says You Are

"Therefore, if anyone is in Christ he is a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come!" (2 Corinthians 5:17 NIV)

One of the greatest blessings of becoming a Christian is receiving a new identity. In the Bible, when God touched and changed a person's life, many times He changed his or her name. He said, "You will be called by a new name that the mouth of the Lord will bestow" (Isaiah 62:2). Saul became Paul. Abram became Abraham. Sarai became Sarah. Jacob became Israel. Simon became Peter.

Likewise, when you accepted Christ, God gave you a new identity and a new name. If you want to know who you really are, then you need to look in the Bible and see who God says you are. It may be different from what you've heard others say about you, but which do you think is more accurate? Who do you think has a better perception of who you are, your Creator, or other creatures just like yourself? If you are a Christian today, the following verses describe your new identity.

My Identity in Christ

Matthew 5:13 - I am the salt of the earth.

Matthew 5:14 - I am the light of the world.

John 1:12 - I am a child of God.

John 15:15 - I am part of the true vine, a channel (branch) of Christ's life.

John 15:15 - I am Christ's friend.

John 15:16 - I am chosen and appointed by Christ to bear His fruit.

Romans 8:14,15 - I am a joint-heir with Christ, sharing His inheritance with Him.

I Corinthians 3:16 - I am a temple of God. His Spirit dwells in me.

I Corinthians 12:27 - I am a member (part) of Christ's body

2 Corinthians 5:17 - I am a new creation.

<u>2 Corinthians 5:18,19</u> I am reconciled to God and am a minister of reconciliation...

Ephesians 1:1 - I am a saint.

<u>Ephesians 1:3</u> - I am blessed with every spiritual blessing in heavenly places.

<u>Ephesians 1:11</u> - I am sealed in Him with the Holy Spirit who has been given as a pledge of my inheritance.

<u>Ephesians 2:10</u> - I am God's workmanship created in Christ to do His work that He planned beforehand that I should do.

Ephesians 4:24 - I am righteous and holy.

Dear God, I thank You that I am a new creation in Christ. I admit that sometimes I feel just like the old me and act like the old me, but I believe by faith that I am brand new. Thank You that my identity is based on my position in Christ rather than my performance on earth.
