Edifying as the Need May Be

A.B. Lipscomb (Gospel Advocate, April 12,1917) Men and women should exercise watchful and painstaking care in verifying messages that are represented to be messages of God. Here we may learn a lesson from Gideon. The Lord spoke to him through His angel. But that he might be assured of his commission, Gideon tested the character and words of this messenger. God now speaks to us through His Son and through the words of His apostles, but we receive their words chiefly through the instrumentality of men who frequently tamper with the message.

The Holy Spirit never speaks of Himself and would not dare express His opinion, but invariably repeats what He has received from the Father and Son. But this is not always true of human instrumentalities. For this reason it behooves us to follow Gideon's example of care and caution, testing the words we hear and comparing them always with the standard of God's word. The sad mistakes that have been made by misguided men in all ages, confounding the passions of their own hearts or the hallucinations of their own minds with the requirements of the New Testament, and even in their heated fanaticism imagining that special revelations were made to them by the Holy Spirit, confirm the lesson before us of not accepting anything as the word of God with only light or insufficient evidence.

Liberal-Mindedness or Weakness?

We meet a great many people in this world who tell us that they would "just as soon go to one church as another." Such characters give assent and approval to every kind of teaching they hear, never stopping to consider whether the teachings they hear and approve today may be radically and directly opposed to those they heard and approved of yesterday. For them "going to some church" is not a matter of conviction but one of convenience. There are those who fall in with every kind of doctrine and every kind of preacher because they think that such a course is liberal-minded. Many times they rest in the allusion that one's being able to lend approval to every kind of a church is a sign of abundant and neverfailing faith. But for a man to accept as his teaching without sufficient evidence any impression or impulse or vision or interpretation of scripture that happens to be presented is not a sign of strong faith; but it is, on the other hand, the evidence of a weak, rash, indifferent and credulous mind.
