Boring Worship

We're told that we need something more exciting in worship. The õtraditionalö way of worshiping God is boring and outdated. We need something more contemporary.

Good friends, since when is praising God a matter of personal preference and human approval? From what we can see in the Bible, anytime man has tampered with worship (as defined by God) he has always messed it up. At the dawn of time, Cain tried to reinvent worship services for God. Whatever God had expected of humans at that time had become insufficient from Cainøs point of view. His brother, Abel, remained true to Godøs word and worshiped by faith in it (Heb. 11:4). But Cain wanted something new and different. The result? "The Lord respected Abel and his offering, but He did not respect Cain and his offering" (Gen. 4:4-5). Cain was guilty of sin (v. 7; 1 John 3:12).

When Jeroboam feared the loss of his kingdom, he reinvented worship for the Jews associated with him. He changed everything in public worship (as defined by the Law) to a pattern more appealing to the masses (1 Kings 12:25-33). The result? õ*This thing became a sin*ö for the people (v. 30).

Jesus taught, õ*God is Spirit, and those who worship Him must worship in spirit and truth*ö (John 4:24). We must mean what we say and say what we mean in worshipí .as we follow Godøs word. We donøt get to determine the activities of worship; Jesus is the only One with all authority (Matt. 28:18). Everything we do in worship must be defined by Him as taught by His apostles (Col. 3:17; Acts 2:42). If itøs not found in the New Testament we are worshiping in ways not acceptable to God, as did Cain and Jeroboam. Worship is a service to God, not a õserve usö of our senses and opinions. The only One qualified to determine if our worship is exciting or not is God, not sinful man who is unworthy of Godøs presence. *óMike Thomas*
