The song "Lily of the Valley", begins by saying, *I have found a friend in Jesus, He's everything to me*. And it is true that Jesus is everything to the Christian. Paul says it best when he states that God

- "hath put all things under his feet, and gave him to be <u>the head</u> <u>over all things</u> to the church, 23. Which is his body, the fulness of him that filleth all in all.", Ephesians 1:22-23. This was prophesied many years ago by the prophet Isaiah.
