This and That

In 2 Corinthians chapter nine, the apostle Paul is urging the people at Corinth to perform an act of charity for needy saints. Apparently this had been a year in coming about, as Paul remembers their zeal of a year ago. He then gives directions on how to do so. The example given the Corinthians can be good for us as well. Let us look at the instructions Paul gave them.

Every man was to give. There was no excuse made for any to fail in giving something. If each person had been good stewards of God's blessings, they should have something to give. So it is with us, we should make it a point to have something to give. It is our duty to do so. This was to be done as it was purposed in heart. This indicates there should be some planning as to how much to give. If we search through our wallet looking for something to give as the plate is passed, we fail to purpose in our hearts.

The giving was not to be done grudgingly or of necessity. This means it was not to be done in grief or sorrow (grudgingly) or pressed upon by circumstances (necessity). If, when we give something into the collection, we are grieved to do so, this fails to follow the instructions Paul gave. He continues by saying that God loves a cheerful giver. The word cheerful means joyous and prompt to do something. Therefore God loves it when we joyfully give into the treasury.

If one gave (sowed) sparingly, he would also reap sparingly. If one gave (sowed) bountifully, he would also reap bountifully. The blessings of being a Christian are many and abundant to the one who gives joyfully of self. The one who doesn't give cheerfully will fail to realize the bountiful blessings of God.

We must give by faith, remembering the words of the Lord Jesus when He said, "it is more blessed to give than to receive." In the text under consideration, Paul says, "God is able to make all grace abound toward you; that ye, always having all sufficiency in all things, may abound to every good work:" In other words, when we give, God is able to make us have abundance so that we may continue to give. Therefore we should give knowing that God will bless us in a good way.

Let us be the type of giver that God desires. The work of the church is important and deserves our support. Think about it.
