This and That

The Bible is a most wonderful book. It is actually 66 books written by about 40 authors over a period of 1,600 years. There are 39 books of the Old Testament and 27 books of the New. The whole of it agrees completely and there are no contradictions. The apostle Paul writes that it is õgiven by inspiration of Godö. Some interesting facts about the Bible:

It was written by those who were directed by the Holy Ghost. Peter said, õFor the prophecy came not in old time by the will of man: but holy men of God spake as they were moved by the Holy Ghostö. This means they wrote what God wanted written. Therefore when one reads the Bible he truly is reading the word of God.

The Bible contains power to change lives. When it is read and appropriated to life, it may have a profound impact on the individual. The writer states, õFor the word of God is living and powerful, and sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing even to the division of soul and spirit, and of joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heartö, Hebrews 4:12. It can change one from a persecutor to helper (Paul) or one who is impulsive and at times weak (Peter) to a strong witness for Jesus. It can and does change lives today.

The Bible provides all that is needed to live profitable and meaningful lives. According to Peter, God has õgiven unto us all things that pertain unto life and godliness, through the knowledge of him that hath called us to glory and virtueö. By taking heed to His word we have all the information and instruction needed to know who we are, what our purpose is in life, and know how to secure our latter end.

The Bible is able to lift people to a higher and nobler existence. In Paulos time people were lifted above paganism and idolatrous living to Godly lives in Jesus. Relationships were improved between nations and guidelines were given for masters and slaves. People from distant lands became brothers and sisters, mothers and fathers.

The Bible is widely available today and is ready to help you in your everyday life. Will you read and study it carefully? Will you apply its teachings and see the good that results. Think about it.
