This and That

There are several times in the book of John that Jesus used the phrase, "I am". We want to examine some of these.

In John 6:35 Jesus said, "<u>I am</u> the bread of life: he that cometh to me shall never hunger; and he that believeth on me shall never thirst". God feeds us physically by sending fruitful seasons. He also feeds us spiritually by giving us instruction and encouragement. He spoke to the fathers by the prophets but He now speaks to us through His Son Jesus. If we give our lives completely to Jesus, He will insure that we are spiritually satisfied at all times. Our faith comes by hearing the word of God (Romans 10:17) and it is an obedient faith which saves us (Ephesians 2:8). Man shall not live by bread alone but by every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of God, Matthew 4:4.

In John 9:5, Jesus said, "<u>I am</u> the light of the world". The world would be a desolate place without light. We have the light of the sun, moon, and stars. We also have light created by man, such as lamps, flashlights and fire. Jesus himself said "I must work the works of him that sent me, while it is day: the night cometh, when no man can work". Spiritually speaking, Jesus is the light of the world. He is *God with us*. His word is a lamp unto our feet and the entrance of His words give light. We can find our way around in this dark world only by taking heed to what He says. He lets us know where we are, where we need to go, and how to get there.

In John 10:7, Jesus said, "<u>I am</u> the door of the sheep". As the good shepherd (John 10:11), Jesus leads His own. He takes care of them as a shepherd would the sheep. The sheep will only follow their shepherd and the voice of a stranger they will not follow. He shelters them in the fold and leads them out to find green pastures and quiet, still waters. His protection is seen in everything He does for the sheep. He is the only way to the father.

In John 11:25 Jesus said, "*I am* the resurrection, and the life". There is no resurrection without Jesus. He has died in the flesh for our sins and has been resurrected by the power of God for our justification, (Romans 4:25). Paul talks about the resurrection at length in 1 Corinthians 15. In verses 22-23, he says, "For as in Adam all die, even so in Christ shall all be made alive. But every man in his own order: Christ the firstfruits; afterward they that are Christ's at his coming. Will you be Christ's at His second coming? Think about it. *Daniel Newell*
