IN HIS BOOK *Wordly Amusements*, Wayne Wilson describes worldly entertainment as that which does at least one of the following...

1. Promotes an evil message. It presents evil as good. This can be done by celebrating sins, such as lying, stealing, murder, fornication, or adultery. Sin is presented in an attractive way.

2. Uses an evil method. Regardless of the point of the story, the performers are made to behave in ways that are shameless and immoral. A story may lead to the conclusion that adultery is bad, but if we must wallow through a sea of flesh to reach this conclusion, the work qualifies as worldly.

No matter how excellent the production or acting, no matter how true the moral of the story, if something promotes an evil message or uses an evil method, the discerning Christian will avoid it!

This and That

God has made available to each generation His words. In the beginning He spoke to the heads of the families directly. After this, the law was written by Moses and given to the people. He then began to supplement this material by speaking through judges and prophets. All of the subsequent writings were gathered together and formed into one canon of scriptures. By the time of Jesus our Old Testament was complete as it is now. The only difference in the scriptures as Jesus knew them and ours is in the arrangement of the books. The Hebrew Bible began with the books of the law and ended with the books of the Chronicles. This is why Jesus spoke of the martyrs Abel and Zacharias in Luke 11:49-51, "Therefore also said the wisdom of God, I will send them prophets and apostles, and some of them they shall slay and persecute: 50. That the blood of all the prophets, which was shed from the foundation of the world, may be required of this generation; 51. From the blood of Abel unto the blood of Zacharias, which perished between the altar and the temple:" The death of Abel is recorded in Genesis chapter 4 and the slaying of Zacharias is recorded in 2 Chronicles 24:20-21.

Most scholars agree that the New Testament was written within a 50 year period beginning about 50 A.D. and was completed near 96 to 100 A.D. Almost immediately the canon of scripture was accepted as it is today. This is, no doubt due to the foreknowledge of God. The original scriptures were written on papyri, a writing material readily available during this time period. Unfortunately these materials do not last very long. Therefore the original manuscripts have been lost. We do have some very good copies that were written on animal skins and produced in the second century. These agree together very well and along with later copies and translations provide us with a very reliable text.

It is remarkable that the entire Bible has been preserved for all these years. Moses began writing in about 1500 B.C. and John finished in about 100 A.D. When comparing manuscripts from different time periods the text is remarkably consistent. This is largely due to the care taken when handling the scriptures while translating or copying. But it is also due to the fact that Jesus said, "Heaven and earth shall pass away, but my words shall not pass away", Matthew 24:35.

Think about it.
