This and That

Though we often concede that we will not reach total and complete perfection in this life, there are ways in which we may seek perfection. We believe and are assured of the perfection of Jesus and the sinless life that He lived. By following His examples we may, at the least, *approach* perfection in various ways. Here are some of the essential elements of perfection:

Benevolence and parting with whatever may hinder us. There was one who came to Jesus and asked what he should do in order to have eternal life. Jesus stated that the commandments must be kept. After hearing that the man had kept the commandments "from my youth up", Jesus then said, "If thou wilt be *perfect*, go and sell that thou hast, and give to the poor, and thou shalt have treasure in heaven: and come and follow me." Of course the man was unwilling to do this. How would you react if you were required to do this? Jesus demands the same of us.

Love. A love that is constantly in action and puts God first in our lives. A love for family and friends that fulfills our duty to them at all times. A love for strangers that would assist them in finding Jesus and understanding their duty toward God. A love for enemies that would not hold grudges and that would search for ways that make for peace. Paul says in Colossians 3:14, "And above all these things put on charity, which is the bond of *perfectness*."

Good works. We are reminded in Titus 3:8 to be careful to maintain good works. And again in James 2:22, "Seest thou how faith wrought with his works, and by works was faith made *perfect*?" *Doing* can bring perfection to what we believe.

Controlling the tongue. James 3:2, "If any man offend not in word, the same is a *perfect* man, and able also to bridle the whole body." What we say is a reflection of what we think, and ultimately, who we are.

Obedience to God. John writes in 1 John 2:5, "But whoso keepeth his word, in him verily is the love of God *perfected*:" The way to true perfection is through obedience Think about it.
