This and That A brief reading of the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Thessalonians letters reveal a number of times in which the Apostle Paul commended the church there. You may recall that the new church was planted by the great Apostle along with Silas and Timothy in Acts 17:1-14. There was immediate opposition from the unbelieving Jews during which Paul and Silas had to escape by night. One accusation laid against Paul was that they had "turned the world upside down." (I have often thought upon that and have come to believe the world, then as now, was already upside down and needed the gospel message to sit it up right once again.) Nevertheless, the church was planted nearly overnight and had continued to persevere. Now Paul was writing to exhort them to continue in the things commanded. During this writing Paul stated ...1 Thessalonians 1:6-7, "And ye became followers of us, and of the Lord, having received the word in much affliction, with joy of the Holy Ghost: 7. So that ye were ensamples to all that believe in Macedonia and Achaia." This little church, started among unbelieving and downright hateful Jewish people, had done so well that Paul said they could be an example for other churches to follow! They had no doubt listened very carefully when Paul, Silas, and Timothy taught them. They must have put this learning into practice each day. They had become so strong that Paul could say, "We are bound to thank God always for you, brethren, as it is meet, because that your faith groweth exceedingly, and the charity of every one of you all toward each other aboundeth; So that we ourselves glory in you in the churches of God for your patience and faith in all your persecutions and tribulations that ye endure:", 2 Thessalonians 1:3-4. What would Paul have to say about our congregation? Think about it. Daniel Newell
