This and That

While reading a book from Leroy Brownlow this past week, I was reminded of the need for, and blessings received from forgiveness. At one time or another, each of us has needed a warm smile that brings forgiveness. Whether it is from spouse, child, coworker, or friend, forgiveness is a sweet scent received with gratitude and indebtedness. Forgiveness also brings relief to the offended party. Many a home has been made dreary and not a few persons have lived life in drudgery, simply because of a refusal to forgive. As Brownlow stated, "One may be imprisoned while he is free or free while he is in prison, depending upon how he binds or looses himself with his own heart." Four types of forgiveness possible, nay necessary:

Forgiveness from God. This is so very important to each of us. Without God's forgiveness, life would be naught but fear, dread, and worry. Because he forgives, we are liberated from self-destruction.

<u>Forgiveness from others.</u> When we have offended another, we should seek forgiveness. Even if we are not sure of the offense, we should seek reconciliation. It is difficult to be one with God while insisting on being at odds with another.

<u>Forgiveness of others.</u> Please be reminded that Jesus died for us and made reconciliation possible even when we were still sinning. Because he forgives, we realize the impression and difference made in our lives. We should be motivated by the same opportunities to make a difference in the lives of others.

Forgiveness of self. The apostle Paul had been guilty of doing much harm to other people. He had also fought against the church of Christ. After his conversion, he needed not only God's forgiveness and the forgiveness of others, but also to forgive himself. He said, "forgetting those things which are behind...I press toward the mark..." Think about it.
