This and That

The word heaven or heavenly is mentioned eighty-four times in the book of Matthew, more than any of the other gospels. Therefore one would assume that it is of primary importance to those who are recipients of the gospel. According to the Apostle Paul there are at least three heavens. He says in 2 Corinthians 12:2, "I knew a man in Christ above fourteen years ago, (whether in the body, I cannot tell; or whether out of the body, I cannot tell: God knoweth;) such an one *caught up to the third heaven.*"

It is generally agreed that the first heaven is where the weather of earth is generated and manifests itself. This is usually referred to as the sky. In God's creation He said, "And God said, Let the waters bring forth abundantly the moving creature that hath life, and fowl that may fly above the earth in the open firmament of heaven.", Genesis 1:20. David, in rehearsing the greatness of God says, "For thy mercy is great unto the heavens, and thy truth unto the clouds. 11. Be thou exalted, O God, above the heavens: let thy glory be above all the earth.", Psalms 57:10-11.

The second heaven is generally thought to be where the celestial bodies reside. "By the word of the Lord were the heavens made; *and all the host of them* by the breath of his mouth.", Psalms 33:6. Also, when God appeared to Abraham and promised to bless him and his seed, God said, "Look now toward heaven, and tell the stars, if thou be able to number them: and he said unto him, So shall thy seed be.", Genesis 15:5.

The third heaven is the place where God resides. "Be not rash with thy mouth, and let not thine heart be hasty to utter any thing before God: for God is in heaven, and thou upon earth: therefore let thy words be few.", Ecclesiastes 5:2. Back to the beginning text, after Paul had said one was caught up the third heaven, he said the one was "caught up into paradise", 2 Corinthians 12:4. Here the word paradise means heaven.

God wants us to dwell with him in heaven. This is why He created the Church, which is referred to as the *kingdom of heaven*. To those at Colossae, Paul speaks of *the hope laid up for you in heaven*, Colossians 1:5. This hope is eternal life. Think about it.
