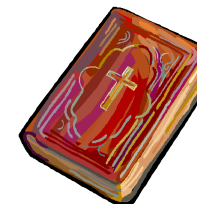

This and That

The book of Philippians is a treat to read and encourages us to keep on keeping on as Christians. To say the Apostle Paul loved these people is an understatement. His love is evident as he writes, “because I have you in my heart.”, chapter 1, verse 7. And again in verse 8, “For God is my record, how greatly I long after you all in the bowels of Jesus Christ.” As you continue reading, it is clear that they are continuing in the fellowship of the gospel as it was delivered to them. This is a comfort to Paul as there are many congregations in other areas that were struggling. The Thessalonica brethren were disturbed about the second coming of Christ. The Corinthian church was troubled about divisions, fornication, and marriage. The Galatians were in danger of falling away. Paul fought much opposition so these churches could continue. Jews and Gentiles alike were threatening him. He had been beaten, shipwrecked, imprisoned, and stoned. In all this Paul remained steadfast and stood front and center for the Lord’s cause. Even though persecutions were having adverse effects in some cities, the church at Philippi had continued to persevere amidst similar environments. This Paul acknowledged and commended them for. In addition to many words of praise, Paul does exhort the people in Philippi to lead a life worthy of the gospel of Christ. In chapter 1, verse 27(nkjv), he says, “Only let your conduct be worthy of the gospel of Christ, so that whether I come and see you or am absent, I may hear of your affairs, that you stand fast in one spirit, with one mind striving together for the faith of the gospel,” The same words need to be taken to heart by the congregations of God’s people everywhere. We need to make sure our conduct is such that others would want to join in our efforts to serve the Lord. Sometimes the best sermon ever preached is a life lived according to the Bible. Paul told the Corinthians, “ye are our epistle, written in our hearts, known and read of all men.” Think about it. Daniel
