This and That "Marriage is honourable in all, and the bed undefiled: but whoremongers and adulterers God will judge," Hebrews 13:4. God has created 3 great institutions. 1. To serve God is the ultimate purpose of each individual. Therefore a Christian should not bind oneself to another whose faith is not in God or is not according to the Bible. "Be ye not unequally yoked together with unbelievers: for what fellowship hath righteousness with unrighteousness? and what communion hath light with darkness?", 2 Corinthians 6:14

2. The first design of marriage is the perpetuation of the human family. There should be an agreement between both parties with respect to children. Genesis 1:27-28

3. The avoidance of fornication. The body, soul, and spirit are united as one. When joined together each is not their own, but part of another. The physical needs of each other are to be supplied by the marriage partner. 1 Corinthians 7:1-3.

4. The need for companionship. If each should care more for the other than for themselves, methinks the marriage would be on solid footing. Remember, there should be no union closer than this union. Should be the best of friends.

5. The permanency of marriage. God's design is one man, one woman, one lifetime. "Wherefore they are no more twain, but one flesh. What therefore God hath joined together, let not man put asunder." Matthew 19:6. Think about it. Daniel Newell
