



This and That

Freedom. It is something that we, as Americans, often take for granted. We speak of being “proud to be an American”. This is a reference to our liberty. However freedom and liberty does not come cheap. Its cost comes in the lives of the men and women who have fought so valiantly to make it possible. Lives have been dedicated to this cause and many have died to preserve it. We erect war memorials to honor the fallen. We proudly wave our banner from government buildings to private residences. We do have something to be proud of here in America. We have been truly blessed by the Father. However we shall be held accountable for those things entrusted to us. We must be good stewards.

In like manner, as Christians, we have a liberty and freedom that did not come easy. It cost the life of Jesus Christ. In Galatians 5:1, Paul says, “Stand fast therefore in the *liberty* wherewith Christ hath made us free, and be not entangled again with the yoke of bondage.” It is clearly stated that those Galatians, and therefore each Christian, has liberty in Christ. Again in John 8:31-32, Jesus stated, “If ye continue in my word, then are ye my disciples indeed; And ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you *free*.” There are two things to mention at this time that we are free from:

1. Freedom from the law. The law is contained in the Old Testament. It required that animal sacrifices be made, tithes be offered, annual treks to Jerusalem, and such. The law constantly reminded one of his shortcomings. Death and blood offerings are constantly on the mind of those held therein. Even with all these requirements it could not make one perfect. We are free from that law according to Romans 8:1-2.
2. Freedom from Sin. Sin is transgressions of God’s law and those found guilty are worthy of death. There are sins of commission, omission, and negligence. One can be made free from sin through obedience to the will of God as found in the New Testament. Paul makes this argument in Romans 6:17-18.

Are you a free person in Christ? Think about it.
