This and That

The Apostle Paul was certainly one of the most gifted people displayed to us in the pages of the Bible. He was passionate about what he believed and defended the truth before paupers and kings alike. Paul did not wander aimlessly in a mass of religious confusion. He found the truth about God and life and then lived according to those beliefs. In 2 Timothy 1:12 he states “*I know whom I have believed, and am persuaded that he is able to keep that which I have committed unto him against that day.*” Paul had committed his entire life and being to the Lord. He had a personal relationship with Jesus. He also wanted to share those beliefs and often spoke to others about their souls salvation. In the first letter to the Corinthians, chapter 9 verse 19, Paul says that he has become the servant of everyone that he might gain them to Christ. He then shows his skill in preaching Christ to others. He approaches people based on their upbringing and current status in life. He writes:

“And unto the Jews I became as a Jew, that I might gain the Jews; Of course Paul was a Jew. He explains his pedigree in Philippians 3:5. What he meant was that he approached the Jewish people based upon their understanding of the scriptures and from there preached Jesus unto them.

“to them that are under the law, as under the law, that I might gain them that are under the law; Paul explained the law to those who followed the law. Whether Jew or proselyte he should that Jesus was the fulfilling of the law.

“To them that are without law, as without law, (being not without law to God, but under the law to Christ,) that I might gain them that are without law.” Paul had to begin with the creation of the world and from there show the fall of man and their ultimate need of salvation.

“To the weak became I as weak, that I might gain the weak:” He placed himself upon the same level of those who were weak in faith so that he may build them up.

Indeed Paul says, “*I am made all things to all men, that I might by all means save some.*” Can we follow Paul’s example and reach others with the gospel? Think about it.
