### This and That

Greetings once again. Our thoughts turn today to a song (#499) in our hymnal that is designed to encourage. The title is, "He is able to deliver thee". Brother Terry leads it on occasion. All three verses of the song begin with the same words, "Tis the grandest theme... " Truly it is a grand thought that God is able to deliver me. Regardless of the sins I may have committed he is able to deliver me from sin. Problems may overtake me to the point of exhausting me but he is there to help. I may reach a point in life where I just don't know where to turn next, however, he is there. There are two points I want to consider at this time.

- 1. God can keep me on my feet. Many times in life things occur that just knocks us off our feet. Rather than just lie there we have the assurance that God will help us get back up and then provide reinforcement. In Romans 14:4 the Apostle uses an example where a person is judging another rather harshly even to the point of knocking him down. But God comes to the rescue. Paul writes: "Who art thou that judgest another man's servant? to his own master he standeth or falleth. Yea, he shall be holden up: for *God is able to make him stand*." Remember friends, our strength cometh from God.
- 2. God can make everything turn out all right for me. Many times the things going on in our lives perplex us. Financially, we may be afraid that things will not work out well for us. This may cause us to fail to support the Lord's work. The Corinthians were faced with a similar situation when Paul wrote in 2 Corinthians 9:7-8, "Every man according as he purposeth in his heart, so let him give; not grudgingly, or of necessity: for God loveth a cheerful giver. And *God is able to make all grace abound toward you;* that ye, always having all sufficiency in all things, may abound to every good work: Friends, God sees the "big picture" and is able to make it all right.
