We happened upon a bargain in rose plants this spring. So four of them go into the buggy and off to home we go. There had to be some thought that went into this family adventure, so we talked all the way to the house about how this is to be done and the rewards in doing so. Once home, we procrastinated for several days. Then one evening after supper the interest was renewed. Everyone is to be involved in the planting. But, where would they go? What tools did we need? How much plant food and water? For the most part Dan planted, Joseph watered, and Mom, Dad and Rachel supervised. The roses are now beginning to put forth leaves. They required another watering just yesterday and again Joseph was up to the task. This made me think. The care of these roses are like the planting and nurturing of the gospel.

The Corinthian church had the benefit of many great men working in their midst. But two that we shall consider are Paul and Apollos. These men had labored together to insure these people were cared for in the gospel. When a quarrel arose between some about who had preached and converted them, Paul said, "I have planted, Apollos watered; but God gave the increase. So then neither is he that planteth any thing, neither he that watereth; but God that giveth the increase." Paul is teaching these brethren that God is the real reason they are planted in the gospel. Yes Paul had preached the gospel to them and many had accepted it. Apollos also had a hand in their being saved. But it was God that made it all possible. He goes on to say, "Now he that planteth and he that watereth are one: and every man shall receive his own reward according to his own labour. For we are labourers together with God:" God was going to reward Paul and Apollos for the work they had done among the Corinthians. There was no need for the brethren there to come to the defense of either. What they should be doing is uniting under the care and leadership of both to become the Christian God wanted them to be. Just like the roses, several people had a hand in caring for them, but if they grow and produce lovely fragrant fruit, it will ultimately be to God's praise and not mans.
