I have worked in several factories in my life. Each one is designed to produce items that the public or private sectors consume. It is important that each piece is within specifications for size and function. Each must fit the container in which it is shipped and, most importantly, each must fulfill its end use. In order to accomplish this there are equipment and manufacturing specifications designed to insure that the product is produced correctly time after time. All along the production path there are inspections that are performed. Trained people choose samples for examination to insure the product is being produced correctly.
