This and That

"Thou shalt not take the name of the Lord thy God in vain; for the Lord will not hold him guiltless that taketh his name in vain", Exodus 20:7. This is one of the commandments that Jehovah declared unto Moses and the children of Israel. Just what does this mean? Does this commandment apply to us today?

The word vain means empty and useless. Therefore to take the name of the Lord in vain would be to use it in an empty and useless way. Examples of this are:

- ?? "Lordy, Lordy, Daniel is ~ 40"
- ?? "Good God,-or- Good Lord you are a mess"
- ?? "My God, just look at this room"
- ?? "Jesus Christ, why did he do that?"

There are more subtle word combinations that just as easily fit into this category. **Does this apply to us today?** The Old Testament does not contain laws that apply to Christians today. They do, however contain examples. In the New Testament we find, *Hallowed* be thy name, Matt. 6:9, *Holy* is his name, Luke 1:49. We are baptized into the name of Jesus. We find salvation in the name of Jesus; we find ones guilty that trod under foot the Son of God. We would be offended if someone used our name in an empty, flippant way. Do we feel the same about our Lord? Think about it.
