

This and That

The book of Ephesians is one of four "prison epistles" which the Apostle Paul wrote while in prison. The other three are Philippians, Colossians, and Philemon. Ephesians is very similar with Colossians in that it magnifies Jesus Christ and presents him as the head of the church and the Lord and Savior of those who would believe. Paul uses the word *body* to describe the church. In Ephesians it is so used nine times and five times in Colossians.

In Ephesians 1:22-23 Paul says that God (has for Jesus) "gave him to be the head over all things to the <u>church</u>, <u>Which is his body</u>, the fullness of him that filleth all in all. Therefore when we come upon the word <u>body</u> later in the book we can understand that it means the church, unless the context tells us otherwise. In chapter 2:16, we find that Jesus reconciled the Jew and Gentile "unto God in one body by the cross". We can certainly understand that Gentiles are welcomed into the Lord's church along with Jews who will live faithful to His teachings. This is reaffirmed in chapter 3:6.

We then come to a passage in chapter 4:4-6 where Paul says that "*There is one body*, and one Spirit, even as ye are called in one hope of your calling; One Lord, one faith, one baptism, One God and Father of all, who is above all, and through all, and in you all." Now we don't have any trouble understanding what is said here. There is only one each of the things listed, body (church), Spirit (Holy Spirit), hope (eternal life, Titus 1:2), Lord (Jesus Christ), faith, (an obedient belief in God's word, Romans 1:5-6), baptism, (water baptism, burial, for the remission of sins, Acts 2:38, Colossians 2:12.), God (creator and sustainer of the world).

Now if there is only one body, where or what is it? You will find the one body, church, where it is created and maintained by what the Bible says. This includes calling Bible things by Bible names. The church will sharply resemble Jesus, as it is His body. We believe that we are a part of that body here at Clay City church of Christ. Will you come and worship God with us?

Think about it.
