This and That

Singing is a wonderful expression of the heart. It has been an element of worship for a long, long time. However, there is a distinct difference in the singing of the church of Christ and denominational churches. One of the first things a person notices when he or she attends a worship service at the Clay City church of Christ is that no instruments are used to accompany the singing. Why is this the case? Why do we choose not to use instruments in our singing service?

- The New Testament simply does not authorize it and we cannot justify what we do in worship by the Old Testament. Jesus fulfilled the Old Testament and replaced it with the New, (Hebrews 10:9-20). Therefore all items of worship must be authorized and directed by the writings of the New Testament. There is not a passage of scripture that states or infers that we should, could, or must use instruments when we sing.
- Paul wrote in Ephesians 5:19 that we should make melody *in our hearts* unto the Lord. According to the usage of the word *psallo* in this passage, the instrument to be plucked or twanged is the heart. Therefore we allow our hearts to make melody unto the Lord.
- In 1 Corinthians 14:15, the apostle Paul said that "I will sing with the spirit, and I will sing with the understanding also." If instruments were to be used would this not be an excellent passage in which to make that known? Instead Paul, again, mentions that the spirit and mind are to be involved in singing.
- Almost unanimously scholars agree that the early church used no instruments. Calvin said "musical instruments in celebrating the praises of God would be no more suitable than the burning of incense, the lighting up of lamps, and the restoration of the other shadows of the law. The papists, therefore, have foolishly borrowed this, as well as many other things, from the Jews."

We believe that the Bible is the inerrant word of God and is profitable for instruction in righteousness. Therefore we attempt to do things in worship as the Bible dictates. Think about it.
