This and That

Matthew chapter 7 has a remarkable lesson for all of us. Many times we think of ourselves in the highest regard while, at the same time, using a different measuring stick for other people. I think one reason for this chapter is to remind us that God measures us all by the same stick (The Bible). A close look at chapter 7 reveals four sets of twos:

- ?? In verses 3-5, there are two brothers. One has a plank in his eye and, remarkably, is able to see a speck in his brother's eye. Jesus says this is hypocritical conduct. He indicates that one should clean his eyes first so that he can see clearly to help another. Does this apply to me?
- ?? Another "two" is revealed in verses 13-14. Here there are two gates. One is narrow and the other is wide and broad. The masses of people are going through the wide gate, However, Jesus indicates the narrow, difficult gate is the way, which leads to life. Which gate have I chosen?
- ?? Two trees are revealed in verses 17-20. Each brings forth fruit, however the fruit of one tree is evil, while the other tree brings forth good fruit. Which tree represents me?
- ?? Finally, in verses 24-27, there are two builders. One builds upon a firm foundation while the other builds upon a sandy foundation. Needless to say, the house built upon the rock stood firm when storms destroyed the other. What foundation supports my life and that of my family? Think about it.
