Three Areas Under Fire

As I listen to the news, I notice three areas that are under fire today. These three areas used to be pretty clear. They used to be better than today. They were at one time plain for all to see. Not anymore.

- (1) <u>Authority</u>. There is a battle going on between federal and state rights. This is seen in the gun issue and gay rights. The Supreme Court is handling cases now that it would not have years ago. What is right or wrong depends on the individual today. For a person to declare there is one exclusive way is considered judgmental. Yet there is a way that is right that can never be wrong. God's way is always the best way.
