Ten Suggestions for Improving Your Experience at Church Services

Is There A Word From the Lord?

During the last eleven years of Judah, the people were exposed to two distinct personalities: Zedekiah the king and Jeremiah the prophet. Zedekiah was a weak and vacillating man. Whatever he saw that would promote what he thought was his best interests, he was willing to do. If that meant allowing idolatry and false prophets to flourish, he allowed them. If he thought it was best to give an impression that he was listening to God, he would try to do that too.

Jeremiah, however, was a strong and godly man. He had resolved to say and do what God wanted him to say and do. For over forty years he preached a very unpopular message. Rather than glibly stating that the king and his kingdom would last in spite of his conduct before God, Jeremiah stated that God would judge both the kingdom and the king. His steadfastness caused him to be mocked and ridiculed, manhandled and rejected. He was beaten and spent time in prison for simply speaking the truth.

Imagine the scene, then, as the weak king looked about him and saw his world slipping away (Jeremiah 37:17ff). He sent for the prophet, the prophet he knew would speak the truth. In secret the king asked, õIs there a word from the Lord?ö Why ask this? Jeremiah had been proclaiming Godøs message for years. Did Zedekiah hope that the message had changed so it would be a little more appealing?

No such luck. Jeremiah replied, õThere is!ö He then said, õYou will be given into the hand of the king of Babylon!ö This was not exactly what Zedekiah wanted to hear. The only way out of this fate was for the king to repent and turn to God. This was something he was not willing to do.

The sad end of the story is that Jerusalem fell and Zedekiah suffered through painful atrocities. He tried to escape at night, but was unsuccessful. He was forced to watch the execution of his sons. Then his eyes were put out. Apparently one of the last things he saw, if not the last thing, was the death of his sons. He was then taken to Babylon, where he later died in prisonô blind, and broken. What a waste! What a tragedy!

How much personal sorrow we could save ourselves if we would but listen to the message of God! The question is not, õIs there a word from the Lord?,ö but õDoes it matter enough for me to change my life?ö
