Filled With Awe For God

At Jesus' crucifixion, "when the centurion and those who were with him...saw the earthquake and what took place, they were filled with awe and said, 'Truly this was the Son of God!' " (Matthew 27:54 ESV). What would our lives look like if we were truly filled with awe for what God has done for us through His Son?

Reverence for God brings Selflessness

In Luke 18, Jesus told a parable about two men who had entered the temple to pray. One of these was a Pharisee and the other, a despised tax collector. The Pharisee sought to bring attention and glory to himself, but the tax collector "would not even lift up his eyes to heaven, but beat upon his breast, saying, 'God be merciful to me, a sinner!' "(v.13)

Having reverence for God means understanding that we are hopelessly lost and NOTHING without Him. Human nature leads us to promote ourselves in all situations, but a healthy respect for God will lead us to cast aside selfish interests and seek Him as the only way to eternal life.

Reverence for God brings Sincerity

In 1 Samuel 1, Hannah was praying earnestly to God for a son. Eli, the high priest, accused her of being intoxicated. Hannah responded: "No, my lord, I am a woman troubled in spirit. I have drunk neither wine nor strong drink, but I have been pouring out my soul before the LORD" (v. 15).

When was the last time we truly poured out our souls before the Lord? Being in awe of God and His plan will lead to a transformation of our innermost beings and will compel us to be dedicated to the study of His Word, to singing and to prayer. These things will not simply be an exercise of going through the motions but will involve the deepest areas of our hearts, souls and minds.

Reverence for God brings Sacrifice

After his incredible treatise on God's mercy and plan for salvation, Paul challenged Christians "to present [their] bodies as a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God" (Romans 12:1). To be a living sacrifice is to dedicate every aspect of life to His service. If we truly reverenced God, would it not be our natural reaction to give our lives to Him?

All of us should examine our lives to determine if the level of reverence we have for God has brought about these results. (Gospel Advocate, February, 2014, page 11)
