Whew! What a week that just passed! Our revival with Brother Phillip Rainwater from Saint Louis was great. We heard lessons that are much needed today. õFathers, Mothers, Children, The Christian Homeö and more was brought to our attention this week. We enjoyed the fellowship of visitors from, Bowen, Stanton, South Irving, Rolling Hills, Campton, and maybe other congregations that I have overlooked. We also had folks visit our congregation this week that has never been here before. Many from our own congregation were able to come each night. It was a wonderful event that glorified God, Edified his saints, and instructed the lost.

Revivals are nothing new. We have evidence of these meetings occurring in the Bible. In each example People are taught the truth, God is proven right, and those who obey are greatly blessed.

Elijah led a great revival that is recorded in 1 Kings 18. Here he is pitted against the prophets of Baal. He is actually outnumbered 850:1.
