Divisiveness is a Sin

I am regularly asked the question,  $\tilde{o}Is$  there a split within the churches of Christ? $\ddot{o}$ 

While I understand the question, Iøm not sure there can really be a õsplitö in the church. Beyond the local congregation, there is no earthly organization or headquarters of the church from which to split.

However, it is clear that some individuals and congregations have changed their beliefs and practices. Some teach ongoing revelation from God; some accept as Christians those who have not been obedient in baptism; some include instruments in worship; and the list goes on. Historically, such congregations usually decide on their own that they don¢t want to be identified as a church of Christ. What is unusual today is that many of these congregations continue to interact with others as if nothing has changed.

While I regret these decisions, God has given each Christian and each congregation the right to make these choices. I can¢t stop what is happening at another congregation or even spend too much of my time worrying about it. Only God can õremove [their] lampstandö (Revelation 2:5), and He will do that according to His schedule.

What I can do is be aware of what is being taught by others. I can then decide where to use my influence and resources in helping other brethren. The Internet is a good tool for learning firsthand about what various individuals and congregations believe.

I recently considered sending money to a congregation to help in a relief effort. I went to their website and found the following: õThe real issue is not the extent to which a woman may participate in the work and worship of the church, but the manner. Pauløs corrective does not ban women from speaking in worship, but stops the disruptive verbal misconduct of certain wivesí ...Put simply, any female who has sufficient and accurate information may teach that information in a gentle spirit to whomever in whatever situation they may be.ö I decided to assist with the effort through another congregation.

We may change, but God does not: õJesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and foreverö (Hebrews 13:8). Christianity is a revealed religion. We have not intuited what to do; we have been told what to do in Godøs Word. We need to be sure we are working to keep ourselves in line with Godøs desires and encouraging others to do the same.
