The apostle John was privileged to watch as Jesus was taken up into heaven. This is recorded in the first chapter of the book of Acts. After gazing for a period of time, John returned from Mount Olivet to Jerusalem. He then labors for over sixty years, telling all who would listen, about salvation through a risen Lord. All of the other apostles gradually pass away, giving their lives for the Gospel cause. John, at last, is banished to a rocky island because he would not compromise the truth.
