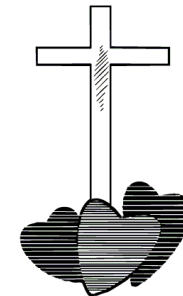

This and That

♪ “Zacchaeus was a wee little man and a wee little man was he. He climbed up in a sycamore tree, for the savior he wanted to see. And as the savior passed that way He looked up in the tree and said, “ Zacchaeus come down! For I’m going to your house today, for I’m going to your house today.” ♪

The story of Zacchaeus is found in Luke the nineteenth chapter. He was a chief tax collector and a very rich man. He no doubt had everything he wanted and needed. However there was someone who was making news around the area and Zacchaeus wanted to find out about him. Many others wanted to see Jesus as well. There was a crowd gathered around and because Zacchaeus was a short fellow, he couldn’t see very well. He could have acknowledged his disadvantage and succumbed to it. However he didn’t accomplish things in life by letting his height be a stumbling block. He found a way to accomplish that which he desired.

How about you and me? Do we allow our shortcomings to dictate our motivation and drive? Or do we find a way to accomplish what is needed? We can learn from Zacchaeus:

He set a goal of seeing Jesus. Each of us needs to look for Jesus. He should become a focal point for us. Of all the things we look for each day, Jesus is the most important. The apostle Paul said, “I can do all things through Christ which strengtheneth me.” Philippians 4:13. Looking for Jesus early and often gives us the strength to accomplish other things.

He formulated a plan. His plan was to elevate himself using the resources that were available to him. He didn’t take advantage of others nor lessen their chances of success. He simply started climbing to reach a new height.

He didn’t allow shortcomings to dictate effort and determination. Regardless of whether we are “too short, too tall, too young, too old, we should take advantage of our talents to set and reach goals that are challenging yet attainable.
