This and That

Paul had heard of the faith and love of the Colossian saints. His purpose in writing was to shore up their faith while correcting some false teaching they had been exposed to. In doing so he used the word hope three times in the first chapter of his epistle. The word means expectation of good. In the Christian sense it means the confident and joyful expectation of eternal salvation. He said their hope was *laid up in heaven*, chapter one, verse five, and that it was *Christ in you the hope of glory*, verse twenty seven. They had received this renewed hope due to their exposure to the gospel. Paul says they had been reconciled to God, *If ye continue in the faith grounded and settled, and be not moved away from the hope of the gospel*, verse twenty three. What "confident expectation of good" did they have due to the gospel?

Their obedience to the gospel had created a right relationship with God and Christ. God had been providing material blessings even in their ignorance. Now they could expect not only material but spiritual blessings. Forgiveness of sins, answer to prayers, indwelling of the Holy Spirit, and membership in His kingdom are but a few of the spiritual blessings found in Christ.

Their exposure to the gospel had provided a new meaning to life. There are many who despair even of life. Suicide is the third leading cause of death among our young in this nation. The gospel provides clear directions for creating and maintaining lasting relationships. When people become important, it gives us reason to live and make contributions to our neighborhoods, schools, workplaces, churches, and families. The most important relationship, with Jesus, is exciting as we think of what can be accomplished with His help. Each day is another opportunity to preach Christ and help humanity.

The gospel gives something to look forward to. The ultimate goal of the Christian is a home in heaven. We realize that this world is not a permanent home and there is something more past the grave. The Bible speaks of a place where there is no sin, death, sorrow, crying, or pain. Such a place is worthy of our best efforts in this life. The gospel makes such a hope possible. Do you want heaven for your home? Is your hope in the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ? Do you have "confident expectation of good"? Think about it.
