This and That

In 1 Corinthians chapter 10 the Apostle Paul has a word of warning for the Corinthian church members. He begins by stating that all the fathers were delivered from Egyptian bondage and "baptized unto Moses in the cloud and in the sea." They "did all eat the same spiritual meat; And did all drink the same spiritual drink: for they drank of that spiritual Rock that followed them: and that Rock was Christ" This indicates they were partakers of that which pleased God.

However not all of these people continued to please God for they "were overthrown in the wilderness." How did this happen and why? Paul tells of why they were displeasing to God and thus "overthrown." In essence they became lustful idolaters who committed fornication and tempted Christ while murmuring.

Lust for evil dominated some while others became idolaters. In becoming an idolater Paul said the people "sat down to eat and drink, and rose up to play." Therefore they were not taking the worship of God seriously, but engaging in idolatrous activities immediately afterward. These activities included fornication, which is Biblically unlawful sexual activity, and tempting Christ. Still others were complainers and murmured. This was written for an example and to warn to us. Paul ends the 12th verse by making the statement, "Wherefore let him that thinketh he standeth take heed lest he fall". We must be diligent in our Christian lifestyle to always be about our Father's business. Peter said, "the devil, as a roaring lion, walketh about, seeking whom he may devour:" Think about it.
