This and That

In Matthew chapter 26, Jesus uses several analogies to represent the kingdom of heaven. The resurrection and judgment is in view in verse 14, as Jesus tells of a man traveling into a far country. He calls 3 servants to whom he gives a measure of money according to each person's ability. The man then leaves and the story's focus shifts to what each servant is doing after their lord leaves. Two of the three are busy trading and working to improve the value of the sum delivered to them. The third is apparently busy digging a hole into which the money is deposited until his lord returns. The first two do a very good job, as the return on their investments doubles their money. How proud they seem to be as they return the money with interest to their lord when he returns. The lord is very happy and pronounces that they are "good and faithful". This indicates they were busy doing what he had expected of them. When the third comes and gives back what was given him, he is pronounced as wicked and slothful (lazy). What he had was then taken from him.

Each person reading this article should relate to one of the three persons represented. Each person has some ability with which they have been naturally endowed in life. What is it that we are doing with our life and talents? Are we working, using our talents to increase upon what God has given us? If so, what a great time when Jesus announces "good and faithful, enter into the joys of thy Lord!" Or, are we digging a hole and placing our lives and talents into it? The Lord wants us to be busy. What contribution are we making to the Lord's kingdom?
