This and That

Shipwrecked! Lost at sea! These are among the most dreaded of words. Who can forget the loss of life associated with the sinking of the Titanic on April 14-15, 1912? The night was supposed to be one of many that would entertain and carry passengers to and from far away destinations in style. However, we all know the disaster that occurred that night, resulting in the loss of 1,517 people.

The apostle Paul was involved in a shipwreck described in the 27th chapter of Acts (one of three he suffered, 2 Cor. 11:25). After appealing to Caesar, Paul was to sail from Caesarea to Rome. The journey began as an uneventful one. Everything went well until the “winds were contrary” in the vicinity of Cyprus. Afterwards “the wind not suffering us”, and “sailing was now dangerous” are used to describe the travel conditions. Paul warned the centurion, as well as both the master of and owner of the ship that there might be loss of ship and lives. Yet they didn’t believe Paul and sailed on. Due to God’s intervention, the 276 people on board survived the ensuing shipwreck, while all else was lost.

It is possible for us to be involved in a shipwreck today with regards to our Christian lives. Paul told Timothy in 1 Timothy 1:19 that he should war a good warfare, “Holding faith, and a good conscience; which some having put away concerning faith have made shipwreck”.

Folks, Faith is the cornerstone of our relationship with Jesus. We just have to increase and protect our faith through Bible study and actualization. How active are you? Think about it.
