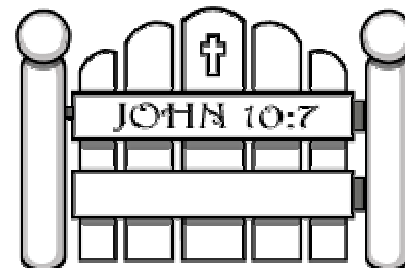

Others may try to second-guess your motives, downplay your ideas, or insult you, but only you know why you do what you do, what you think and feel, and how you relate to God. Stay true to who you are in Christ Jesus!

In closing the first letter to the Thessalonians, the apostle Paul said, “And the very God of peace sanctify you wholly; and I pray God your whole spirit and soul and body be preserved blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.” Paul had also told the Corinthians and the Philippians to be blameless. Here Paul indicates that his desire was for the Thessalonians to be so completely sanctified and blameless that he dissects the Human being into three parts. This shows a distinct difference between the spirit, soul, and body of man.

Your whole spirit should be blameless. In First Corinthians chapter two and verse eleven, Paul says, *For what man knoweth the things of a man, save the spirit of man which is in him?* This would indicate the mind of man would be equal to his spirit, for the mind is the knowing part of man. In Romans 12:2 Paul says we should be *transformed by the renewing of your mind.* Therefore a Christian should think differently than they did before accepting Jesus. The purpose of Christianity is bringing *into captivity every thought to the obedience of Christ;* 2 Corinthians 10:5

Your whole soul should be blameless. When Moses wrote of the beginning of man, he stated that *the Lord God formed man of the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a living soul.* In the original Hebrew, the word *soul* may also be translated *life.* Therefore we conclude that the soul of man is the life force within man. Our life should be one that is blameless. In Colossians 3:4 Paul indicates “Christ is our life”.

Your whole body should be blameless. Paul said in 1 Corinthians 6, *Now the body is not for fornication, but for the Lord; and the Lord for the body... Know ye not that your bodies are the members of Christ?... know ye not that your body is the temple of the Holy Ghost which is in you, which ye have of God, and ye are not your own? For ye are bought with a price: therefore glorify God in your body, and in your spirit, which are God's.* Our bodies are to be used to fulfill God’s will also. Think about it.
