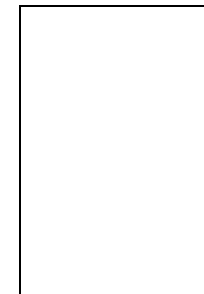

This and That

In Luke 13:23, one came to Jesus with a question. "Lord are there few that be saved?" is a very important question. If there are few that be saved, and Jesus said there would be, the inference is that either God is willing/able to save only a few or that a small number will make it to safety due in some measure to their own effort. Let's look at each premise carefully.

If God is willing to save only a few, it must be because God is a respecter of persons. Whether the number saved is due to space constraints in heaven, God's ability to save, or his willingness, we are bound to place the responsibility solely on God. The Bible refutes this premise. Peter states in 2 Peter 3:9, that God is "not willing that any should perish." Paul says in 1 Timothy 2:4 that God "will have all men be saved and come unto the knowledge of truth." Jesus assures in John 14:2, "In my Father's house are many mansions". This refutes the notion that God is somehow limited or unwilling. God wants everybody to be saved.

Is the number saved due in some measure to man's efforts? In Matthew 7:13-14, Jesus states the number will be affected to a large degree by man's choice in this life. If we choose the gate less restrictive and most receptive to our inventions and desires, we will be following a large number to destruction. If, however, we choose the narrow way that leads to life, we will be part of a few.

God's word is the gate to salvation. David looks to God's word for help: "Concerning the works of men, by the word of thy lips I have kept me from the paths of the destroyer." The Bible alone is the way to eternal life and we would do well to heed what it says. Are you willing to lay aside what you have been told, what you believe, in order to listen to God? Think about it.
