This and That

We read in Genesis chapter 22 of the testing of Abraham's faith. He was asked to offer his son as a burnt sacrifice to God. Of course, God did not intend for Abraham to literally follow through with the request. He wanted Abraham to realize the fullest expression of faith. A great test of faith must have been, when in verse 7, his son makes the following inquiry, "Behold the fire and the wood: but where is the lamb for a burnt offering?" What would be Abraham's response? He knew the reason for the journey. He must have fought back intense emotions. However, Abraham's response was this, "My son, God will provide himself a lamb for a burnt offering: so they went both of them together." This God did, as a ram was caught by its horns in a thicket. This was used as a substitute for his son.

There was another substitute to be made in the future. The human family was guilty of the grossest offenses imaginable against God and his Christ. Due to man's sinful lifestyle, death was the just penalty. However, in John's gospel, chapter 1, verse 29, we hear John the Baptist exclaim, "Behold the Lamb of God, which taketh away the sin of the world." Jesus had made himself the sacrifice for everyone's sins. Due to his death on the cross anyone who desires to be made free from sin can be liberated. As Paul states, "For he hath made him to be sin for us, who knew no sin; that we might be made the righteousness of God in him", 2 Corinthians 5:21. Indeed, one can be made perfectly free from sin today by obeying God's commands. Not only that, but also one can become a member of the Lord's church and a child of God. The request God makes of us is to, "Repent and be baptized", Acts 2:38. And, "Be thou faithful until death and I will give thee a crown of life", Revelation 2:10. We should be extremely thankful to and respectful of God's "Lamb". Jesus paid a debt he didn't owe, because we owed a debt we couldn't pay. Think about it. Daniel Newell
