This and That

When God created everything in the beginning it was pronounced good. The Sun, moon and stars were good. The trees and fruitful fields were good. The beasts of the field and the creeping things were good. The foul flying in the heavens and the fish of the seas were all good. Man and woman were good. They were made in the image of God. Everything was good and right with the world. Things are not that way anymore. Why? Solomon states in the Ecclesiastical letter chapter 7, verse 29, "Lo, this only have I found, that God hath made man upright; but they have sought out many inventions." Man has "invented" many things that have had a negative impact upon themselves and others. In the natural world such inventions may be the desire for riches to the neglect of the eternal. It would include man's desire for pleasure of the flesh to the loss of the soul. Adultery, fornication, unclean lifestyles, idolatry, hatred, drunkenness, reveling parties, and such are mentioned in the Galatians' letter as works of the flesh. These are truly inventions of man that interfere with the "Good" which God at the first created. In the religious realm, there are inventions such as church governments and councils, infant baptism, instrumental music, and unscriptural worship arrangements. The religion preached and practiced by Paul the Apostle was simple and practicable by all knowledgeable people. When Peter was asked what to do for remission of sins, he clearly stated, "Repent and be baptized". When Phillip went down to Samaria he "preached Christ unto them". When Jesus was teaching a group of people he stated that the wise would "Hear these sayings of mine and do them". When Paul was facing his impending death, he indicated his confidence in the future by saying, "I have fought a good fight, I have finished my course, I have kept the faith, henceforth there is laid up for me a crown of righteousness." You see we complicate things when we throw in our "inventions". God knows what he is doing. Allow him to create and sustain while we submit and obey. Have our "inventions" gotten in the way of good? Think about it.
