Ten little words in the Roman letter should cause us to pause and reflect. What is my life? What is it that I am trying to accomplish each day? Is God real? If so am I doing the things he requires of me? Or, am I being passively disobedient?

According to the Bible, our lives have been given us by the power of the Almighty One. He is the one who created human life in the dawn of creation. He it is that made them male and female. If the Bible is true, there must be a higher plan for our lives than the world would have us believe. According to the philosophy of man and false sciences we are the result of an explosion in the universe and the evolution of a lower species. Yet ten little words in the Roman letter should cause us to question whether this is so.
