



This and That

Jonah was a prophet of God. He is first introduced in 2 Kings 14:25. Here he prophesied during the reign of Jeroboam the king of Israel. The only information revealed about Jonah was that he was of Gathhepher, a town in Zebulun in the northern kingdom of Israel. Of course the most we know about Jonah is revealed in the Old Testament book that bears his name. We know that Jonah had a very interesting thing happen to him when he disobeyed God. He was swallowed by a great fish and remained inside it for three days and three nights. However, Jonah is not unlike a lot of people today. Some of the similarities are:

- Jonah was reluctant to do what God wanted, Jonah 1:3. This is true of many today. God wants us to repent and be baptized. He wants us to live according to his words in the Bible. But many people fail to do these things. The reason is not because these things are extremely difficult to do or would require things unavailable. The reason many times is because of indifference.
- Jonah didn't want to be in the presence of the Lord, Jonah 1:10. Being disobedient made him feel fearful being where the Lord was. He went out of the way to flee from where he thought God was. Some today stay away from the Bible because God is revealed therein. Church attendance is not something high on the list either because God is there. Godly people may be avoided because they make one uncomfortable.
- When he got into trouble he called out unto God, Jonah 2:7. We may refrain from praying or reading the Bible until something unfortunate happens to us. Then we feel repentant and ask for God's help, just like Jonah.

Let us learn from Jonah's experience and realize that God is just and loving. He wants people to be saved from sin, and to experience the true meaning of life. This begins by doing what we know God wants done. To be in God's presence is a truly great experience. Think about it.
