This and That

One of the characteristics of God is that he is omniscient. This means He possesses universal and complete knowledge. The thought that there is nothing he does not know has preserved me through many a temptation and trial. God knows everything.

- When I lose faith in myself, I realize there is nothing about me that he does not know. This is far greater knowledge than I possess about myself. In Matthew 10:30, Jesus says, "*But the very hairs of your head are all numbered.*" If the hairs on my head are numbered, and the count would change daily, there must be nothing about me that he does not know. This makes me to understand that I important to God. I know I can succeed at whatever God requires of me. Because he knows *me*.
- When I wonder about the world I live in, when I am afraid and in doubt, I realize that he knows everything about it. In Psalms 147:4-5, the writer states, "*He telleth the number of the stars; he calleth them all by their names. Great is our Lord, and of great power: his understanding is infinite.*" If God knows the heavens, and every star is counted, then surely he takes thought for the earth whereon he has placed mankind. God says, "*For every beast of the forest is mine, and the cattle upon a thousand hills. I know all the fowls of the mountains: and the wild beasts of the field are mine. If I were hungry, I would not tell thee: for the world is mine, and the fullness thereof.*" Psalms 50:10-12. Yea, God is aware of the needs of the earth and its inhabitants.
- When I am afraid about the future, I realize God is there. He is aware of the end from the beginning. He also taketh thought for *me*. Job spoke well in chapter 31:4 when he said, "*Doth not he see my ways, and count all my steps?*" I know that if I but trust in the Lord and walk in his paths, my future will be secure. For God has spoken through the psalmist, "*Mark the blameless man, and observe the upright; For the future of that man is peace.* Psalms 37:37nkj.
