This and That

Is it important what we listen to? In the last 75 years we have gone from listening to whippoor wills on the front porch, to listening to a blue-tooth enabled earphone on the way to a business meeting. It seems as though life has gotten faster as technology has increased. Our access to information is greater than it has ever been. This is not bad of itself, but I am afraid it has reduced our ability to sift through the information as well as desensitized us to its affects. We must instantly decide what is important and what is background noise. In matters of finance, a bad decision may cost us money. In religious matters it may cost us our future. Jesus said, õTake heed what ye hearö, Mark 4:24. And again, õTake heed therefore how ye hearö Luke 8:18. We should determine to establish our future by listening to Jesus. He õhath the words of eternal lifeö John 6:68. Listening effectively does not come naturally to most people. It must be developed patiently. We should start by listening to Jesus. He speaks through his word, the Bible. Daniel Newell

Words are powerful things. Because words convey ideas and ideas influence our thinking, words can move us toward being what God wants us to be, or they can pull us away from that. For better or worse, our basic character right now is mainly the result of all the words that have influenced us over our lifetime.

Satan does his deadly work, of course, by means of deceitful words. His lies lead us to disobey God, and when we follow that lead, we die spiritually and are lost. Untruth is at the bottom of all that the devil does. Words that come from him are malicious and destructive in their falsehood. Concerning the devil, Jesus said, õHe was a murderer from the beginning, and does not stand in the truth, because there is no truth in him. When he lies, he speaks out of his own character, for he is a liar and the father of liesö (Jn. 8:44).

In bold contrast, Godøs words are infallibly true.ó they give light and life, The writer of Hebrews went so far as to say, õit is impossible for God to lieö (Hb. 6:18). The power of God to salvation from sin is in the totally truthful gospel of Christ (Rom. 1:16). Jesus said it plainly: õYou will know the truth, and the truth will set you freeö (Jn. 8:32). It is by words of truth that God breaks the power of the deviløs deceit.

We need to have a deep, abiding respect for Godøs truth. No matter how powerful it is, the truth will not do us any good if we do not receive it properly. Since Jesus is õthe source of eternal salvation to all who obey himö (Hb. 5:9), we must choose to listen and respond to Godøs word in an honest manner. And not only must we hear honestly, but we must be õdoers of the wordö (Jas. 1:22). As Jesus said, õEveryone who hears these words of mine and does not do them will be like a foolish man who built his house on the sandö (Mt. 7:26).

IT IS IMPORTANT TO HEAR GOD¢S WORD REVERENTLY AND OBEDIENTLY. It will be good if we make the coming week a week of growth in the quality of our õhearing.ö Jesus warned, õTake care then how you hearö (Lk. 8:18), and that¢s a warning we need to pay frequent attention to. *Gary Henry – WordPoints.com*
