Little Sins: by Gregory Tidwell

As we remember our heritage, we recall the fundamental issues of our day do not differ in substance from the issues Christians faced in the past. David Lipscomb included a short essay on % it le Sins+in the October 5, 1871 issue of the Gospel Advocate, which is just as relevant today as it was 140 years ago:

Where are two ways of coming down from a church steeple: one is to jump down, and the other is to come down by the steps; but both will lead you to the bottom. So, also, there are two ways of going to hell: one is to walk into it with your eyes open. few people do that. the other is to go down by steps of little sins, and that way, I fear is only too common. Put up with a few little sins, and you soon will want a few more; even a heathen could say, Who was content with only one sin?+. and your course will be regularly worse each day. Well did Jeremy Taylor describe the sin in man: %First it startles him then it becomes pleasing, then easy, then delightful, then frequent, then habitual, then confirmed. Then the man is impenitent, then obstinate, and then he is damned. Reader! The devil only wants to get the wedge of a little allowed sin in your heart, and you will soon be all his own. Never play with fire . never trifle with little sins+:

Error seldom comes into our lives or into the church in one great leap. Rather, we go into error step by step. We see this digression in a looser view toward the work and worship of the church and in a looser view of personal morality and individual commitment. A congregation begins using instrumental music at social events, then in devotional settings, and eventually in worship on the Lords day. A family begins using wine for special celebrations, then occasionally in their home, and eventually embraces social drinking. No one introducing instrumental music at a youth event says, %his is the first step toward unauthorized worship,+just as no one thinks of taking a glass of wine as moving down the path to drunkenness.

% ne who is faithful in a very little is also faithful in much.+Luke 16:10 reminds us, % and one who is dishonest in a very little is also dishonest in much+(ESV). We must keep diligent to remain faithful in the small things. If we do, the larger things will take care of themselves.
