As you may know, the church here at Clay City is in the process of identifying and installing qualified men to be Elders. During the most recent business meeting the following plan was agreed to:

- During the month of January there will be sermons and lessons delivered from the pulpit regarding elders
- The first two weeks of February (Feb. 1 through Feb. 14)
   nominations will be accepted from the entire membership.
- Afterward, those nominated will be interviewed by a group of elders from another congregation, led by Jack Hall of the Richmond congregation. This will take place from February 15<sup>th</sup> through March 16<sup>th</sup>. Recommendations will be made by this group to the church at Clay City.
- During the remainder of March (March 17<sup>th</sup> through March 31<sup>st</sup>, a time will be set aside for installations of Elders.

We ask that everyone be in prayer about this great undertaking. It will take all of us working together to have elders as God would have us to.

#### These Things Command and Teach: by G.C. Brewer

There is not a more neglected duty than that of teaching. It cannot be, however, because it is not clearly taught by the Bible. God has enjoined this duty in every age or dispensation. The Israelites were to teach % wery man his neighbor+saying, % now the Lord+. They were to set up pillars of stone in memory of the power of Jehovah, and they were to relate these things to their children and their children and their children. They were to talk of the laws of God at all times and under all circumstances, or the Bible better expresses it in this language:

"And these words, which I command thee this day, shall be upon thy heart; and thou shalt teach them diligently unto thy children, and shalt talk of them when thou sittest in thy house, and when thou walkest by the way, and when thou liest down, and when thou risest up. And thou shalt bind them for a sign upon thy hand, and they shall be for frontlets between thine eyes. And thou shalt write them upon the door-posts of thy house, and upon thy gates" (Deuteronomy 6:6-9 ASV).

Men have to be constantly reminded of their duty even after they have learned it, or they will forget. We sometimes feel backward about teaching a certain thing because we think it has been % reached to death but none of Gods laws will ever grow old or cease to be enforced as long as God has subjects on the earth. They cannot be talked of too much. Men may advance theories about Gods laws that will wear out and that need revising, restating and amending. But the Word of God lives forever.

It is the duty of every congregation to teach the children and young people in its reach, and all proper means should be used to reach them. While they are young and their minds are not filled with evil nor disturbed by doctrines of men is the time to sow the good seed. In many communities of the rural districts and every town, there are children who do not attend Bible school anywhere but who could, with little inducement, be brought to the house of the Lord and taught. This is a work that any member of the church, man or woman, can do. O, the magnitude of such work! What might be the outcome?
