Consumer Religion Versus Christianity

When recently asked for their religious preference, fewer members of the "culturally relevant" churches called themselves "Christians" (Christianity Today). This does not surprise us, for Jesus does not bless those who strive to keep up with the culture. He blesses those who lose their lives in following Him. Many members today want a "consumer friendly" church that will meet their needs. Jesus considers such thinking an anti-gospel attitude of the flesh.

God's power is released only through the gospel of daily cross-bearing (Romans 1:16), which is reprehensible to the flesh. Did Jesus not warn that only the minority travel the road of self-denial? In their carnal desire to please rather that deny self, many church members demand a church "of their choice". They want a church that provides good programs for all members, that is staffed by professionals who put on star-studded worship services of loud music and entertainment, and that know how to make all church activities fun, feel-good experiences.

What a contrast to brothers and sisters who assemble around the world under the threat of persecution! They walk or ride bicycles in the hot, blazing sun for miles to meet in a small, dimly lit room with no AC. They have no padded pews to sit on. They meet with open Bibles to study the Word of God, which they love - the very Word that threatens to send them to prison or have their tongues cut out to silence them from sharing the message so near and so dear to their hearts!

These Christians are today's real heroes of faith. They have answered the call of the Spirit to take up their crosses daily and follow Jesus (Luke 9:23). They know the peace that comes from counting themselves crucified with Christ (Romans 6:11). They have found such pure love and joy in Jesus that they have no need for worldly amusements. They know that only when they are dead to the world can Jesus live His new life of the Spirit through them (Galatians 2:20). They know that His joy, peace, and love are worth dying for (spiritually and physically)!

Perhaps our brothers and sisters in developing nations have found a greater treasure than we Americans have found in our bank accounts. May we also discover their "hidden treasure" and be willing to sell all we have to purchase it (cf. Matthew 13:44)!
