

This and That

When I was a young boy my mother used to make plastered and painted images of animals and farm items. She would then use these in her house, give them away as presents, or occasionally sell them. I remember watching her wash and prepare the form, then mix the plaster to the right consistency and pour it into the mold. After several hours the project would harden and, when removed from the form, take the shape of the mold into which it was poured. These were then painted and allowed to dry. Afterwards they were ready for use. They were hung on walls or used to decorate a corner table. In the same way when one obeys the gospel he or she is "poured into a form". Let me explain.

The Apostle Paul, in Romans 6:17-18, said, "But God be thanked, that ye were the servants of sin, but ye have obeyed from the heart that form of doctrine which was delivered you. 18. Being then made free from sin, ye became the servants of righteousness." The doctrine delivered was the gospel news of Jesus' death, burial, and resurrection, 1 Corinthians 15:1-4. You see Jesus is our example and when He died, was buried, and rose again He created a form for us to follow. In order to be saved from our sins we must become dead to sin. This means that we turn from our sins unto God and decide to live for the Lord. It is as though we put to death our former life in repentance. We then must be buried, not in a literal grave, but in the burial waters of baptism. When we are raised from the waters we are then a new creature in Christ Jesus. According to Paul it is at this time that we are made free from sin. Paul said it this way, "What shall we say then? Shall we continue in sin, that grace may abound? 2. God forbid. How shall we, that are dead to sin, live any longer therein? 3. Know ye not, that so many of us as were baptized into Jesus Christ were baptized into his death? 4. Therefore we are buried with him by baptism into death: that like as Christ was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life. 5. For if we have been planted together in the likeness of his death, we shall be also in the likeness of his resurrection: 6. Knowing this, that our old man is crucified with him, that the body of sin might be destroyed, that henceforth we should not serve sin," Romans 6:1-6.

Have you obeyed the <u>form</u> of the doctrine of Christ? If not will you consider it today? Think about it. Daniel Newell
