Have Courage

Be Strong! And of good courage! Do not be afraid For the Lord your God goes with you. He will not leave you nor forsake you. Deuteronomy 31:6

Dr. Henry Poppen was one of the first missionaries to go to China, and spent over forty years there. He once told about the time he went to a remote village where presumably missionaries had never before visited.

Dr. Poppen told them about Jesus-how Jesus was gentle, kind, loving and able to forgive easily. When he finished talking about Jesus, one of the village men came to him and said, "Oh, we know Jesus! He has been here!"

"No, no," the missionary protested, "Jesus lived and died in a country far from here, long ago."

"Oh no," the people replied. "He died here. Come, we will show you his grave."

The villagers led Dr. Poppen outside the city to a Chinese cemetery where an American was buried. There on the tombstone was the name of a Christian medical doctor who, all on his own, felt called by God to go and live in this village, and to die there. When the villagers heard what Jesus was like, they remembered the doctor.
